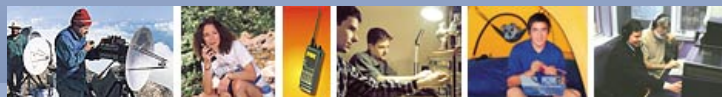

Oregon Section News - January 2014

Hello all,

I wanted to send out one final section news while I have access to the page to do so.

Most of you have heard that Jim Fenstermaker, K9JF, has been elected by his peers on the ARRL Board as a Vice-President. That left the directors chair open, which has been filled by former Vice Director Jim Pace, K7CEX. I have been appointed to fill the Northwestern Division Vice Director position.

I have been the Oregon Section Manager for nearly eight years, having first been elected in 2006. It really does not seem nearly that long. I had to recount the years several time because I couldn't believe I counted correctly. I guess time flies when you are having fun!

You will still be seeing me around the state at various hamfests and I will be happy to continue coming to your club meetings as a visitor to your regular activities or to present to the club, either one. I consider the McMinnville Amateur Radio Club to be my home club since that is the first one I went to as a new ham and they welcomed me with open arms. The club president called me after the first meeting I went to and checked to make sure I was coming to the next meeting. Her husband was the ARES Emergency Coordinator and showed up at the meeting with an ARES application. They were also going to be doing communications for a road rally in the mountains the next weekend and talked me into volunteering immediately.

The first hamfest of 2014 will be on February 15 in Rickreall; the Salem Hamfair. I hope to see all of you there. I will be near the ARRL table most of the day.

We also will have the 7QP contest coming up the first weekend of May. Oregon always has a good showing and a lot of work goes into making sure someone is representing every county in the state. If you have never tried contesting this is a good place to experiment and see if you like it. Do an Internet search for 7QP and it comes right up.

I posted these two events on the section website calendar with their links so they are easy to find.

This year is the ARRL Centennial celebration. Visit the ARRL website and find information on all the activities. A year-long QSO party has already started and strong stations in each state are scheduled for contacts. If you are interested in participating all that information is available on the ARRL website with links on the front page. There will also be activities at Seapac this year to celebrate the centennial. Make sure you have your hotel reservations since rooms are going fast.

I know everyone who gets this message directly is already an ARRL member but I was reminded of what the organization offers to us as I renewed my professional association memberships at the end of the year. I belong to two associations. One costs \$160 annually. The second costs \$230 annually. The ARRL offers us many of the same things as those professional associations offer. I often mention at meetings that the ARRL really is our professional association as ham radio operators and is much less expensive than those related to our careers.

I am interested in continuing to hear from all of you as I transition to my new position.



It's time to start planning for the 7QP weekend if that has not been on your mind already. Visit <http://www.7QP.org> for the current Planned Operations for Oregon:

See all those empty counties? Don't assume that just because there may be a lot of hams in your county you can skip it. We need a lot more operators signing up for both fixed and mobile operations. We'd like to see five entries in each one. If you are going to play in the 7QP, please send an email to 7qpops@codxc.org and let us and the world know. Having your call in the table is an easy way to have the world looking for you - be rare for a day!

We have been pulling all the strings to arrange for good propagation conditions on May 4. All the contest calendars have been informed. We are even bringing in mobiles from the east to run through some of the very rarest counties along the eastern edges of Montana and Wyoming. In Oregon we are doing our part to make this the best QSO party of the year.

Big news from N1MM-Logger. No, it has nothing to do with chain saws. This most popular FREE logging software has been upgraded to allow entry of multiple county exchanges. If a station in Arizona sends AZGHM/GLE, you enter that in the exchange block. You get credit for two QSOs, and Graham and Greenlee Counties. That's no big deal for us in Oregon (it only counts as Arizona) but this also happens with exchanges from the Indiana and New England QSO parties that share our weekend. If you have never tried a logging program, you need to check one out. There's a list of FREE and low cost programs on the 7QP web site. Click the Logging Software link along the left hand edge of the page.

So there you have it. We are shaking the trees and kicking the bushes to get the word out. Once the table gets filled in we can concentrate on filling in the bare spots and strong-arming the usual suspects. Hey, we've got Gilliam County covered already. Anyone want to light up Curry County? It's wide open and there's nobody home.....
